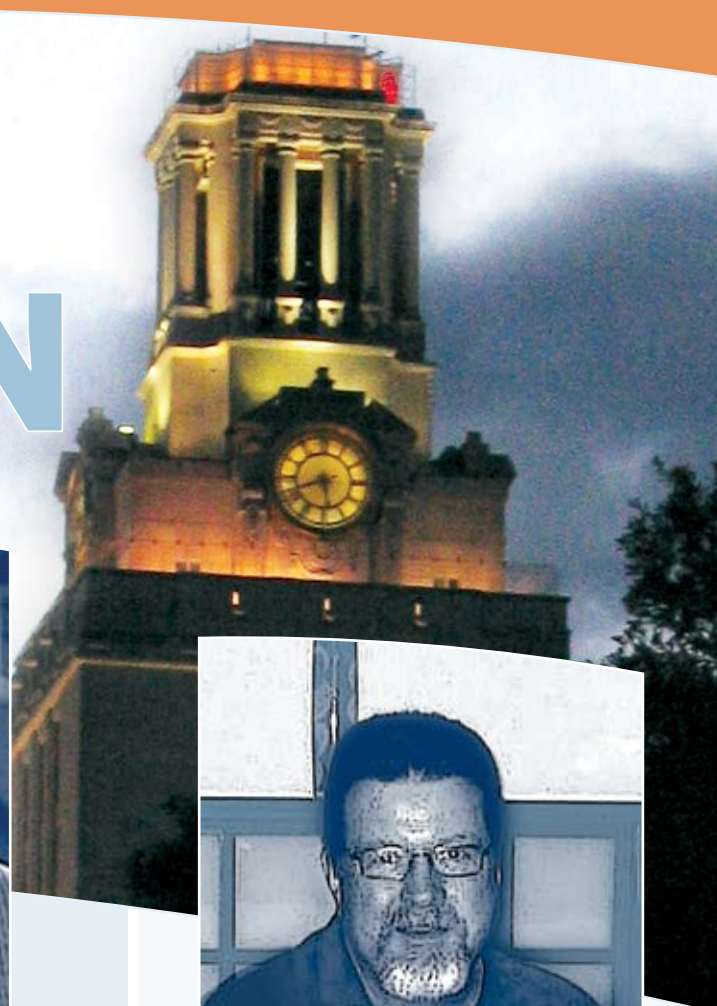

of Law at Columbia and A.W.
Walker Centennial Chair of Law
at UT,** is a historian of nuclear
strategy. He has served in the
White House, the Senate, and the
National Security Council. As one
of the nation’s leading constitutional
theorists, Professor Bobbitt’s
interests include constitutional
law, international security, and the
history of strategy. He has published
six books, including *The Shield of
Achilles: War, Peace and the Course
of History* (Knopf, 2002). He was
the 2003 Grand Prize Winner of the
Robert W. Hamilton Awards.
